MIGRANT ENTREPRENEURSHIP FOR SOCIAL INCLUSION

The study "Promoting and Migrant Supporting Entrepreneurship" (European Commission, has 2016), demonstrated that measures for challenges addressing these should be approached holistically: by providing migrants educational training opportunities, regulatory advice, social capital, and facilitated access to business funding and working spaces. However, efforts to address these challenges in a holistic approach by local organisations are often described as too resourceintensive and thus do not have a long-term impact.



The project was presented to the members of the 'Management and Implementation of Development Projects' and 'Organization Change and Development' MSc programmes of the University of Manchester.

MESI IN SHORT

The project will develop a training curriculum and an e-course specifically designed to tackle the educational and training needs of migrants by equipping adult education professionals, trainers and professionals working migrants with the tools needed for engaging migrants in entrepreneurial initiatives as well as increasing their participation in such activities. The curriculum will increase the capacity of professionals in designing outreach activities to support entrepreneurial activities created by migrants and therefore increase the participation of migrants in the socio-economic life and involvement of migrants in educational programmes.

MESI OBJECTIVES

- ❖ Increase capacity of adult education professionals, trainers and professionals working migrants (target groups) with the tools needed for engaging migrants in entrepreneurship;
- ❖ Enhance knowledge of the target groups to design outreach activities to support entrepreneurial activities created by migrants;
- ❖ Participating migrant entrepreneurs have better conditions to start a business when they have a better knowledge about entrepreneurship.
- ❖ Enhance collaboration and the promotion of synergies between the target groups and other stakeholders for the promotion of migrant entrepreneurship;
- Support the efforts of local and EU organisations in applying a holistic approach in supporting migrants entrepreneurs through the development of OER tools.

EXPECTED RESULTS

- ❖ Increased capacity of adult education professionals, trainers and professionals working migrants (target groups) with the tools needed for engaging migrants in entrepreneurship;
- Strengthened knowledge of the target groups to design outreach activities to support entrepreneurial activities created by migrants;
- Strengthened collaboration among professionals working with migrants at a local and EU level.
